



Be a part of this summer's action on Climate Change and **Pedal for the Planet!**

If you enjoy cycling, and you care about the environment: get involved in 'the pedal'.

C2C (Canada 2 Copenhagen): Pedal for the Planet is a national bike relay organized under the umbrella group of over 40 social and environmental organizations: **Kyotoplus**.

Starting on July 3, 2009, Canadians from the east and west coasts will travel across the country in organized bike rides and walks, and then come together as a mass group in Ottawa on the weekend of September 18-20. The 'pedal' is intended to relay a message to our government that we expect real leadership and serious reductions when the Copenhagen climate treaty is negotiated in December.

How You Can Get Involved:

Volunteers are needed every step and pedal of the relay. You can get involved in whatever way you can. We need:

- Participants: to actively take part in organized rides and walks (you choose your own distance);
- Tour Leaders: experienced cyclists who are capable of leading portions of the relay. A small stipend is offered for long-distance leaders.
- Volunteer drivers: to drive our hybrid, electric support vehicles for parts of the trip.
- Logistics people: to help identify and secure places to stay along the route (organic farms, hostels, campgrounds), along with donations, food, supplies, etc.
- "Local coordinators" to organize participants and events in your area.
- And we need donations & support ... to ensure that this is a successful event across the country
